


The Grande Ronde Basin is quite a large basin that drains most of the northeastern corner of our State. The system has five tributary rivers.

Two are accessible by trail only, the Wenaha near the Washington state line and the Minam that flows northward between La Grande and Enterprise. Catherine Creek drains the upper eastern part of the Grande Ronde Valley; the Wallowa and Lostine Rivers flow out of the Wallowa Valley.

The Grande Ronde system supports a good fishery for salmon and steel-head. These fish migrate up the Columbia and Snake Rivers and travel approximately 650 river miles before they reach the spawning areas in the upper reaches of the basin. The Lower Grande Ronde enjoys a fall steelhead fishery; the upper tributaries have spring salmon and in some instances spring steel-head. In the peak of the season angling pressure is heavy and success is good.

This report details a plan that we hope can be followed to solve the access problems of the Grande Ronde Basin. Too, we hope that all agencies that are interested in retaining existing water access as well as providing additional facilities, whether they be municipal, county, or state will all join in a cooperative effort to carry out this plan in an orderly manner. It is probable that Land and Water Conservation Funds will be available on a 50-50 matching basis. In order to acquire these funds, it will be necessary to apply through the Oregon State Highway Department.

Thirty-eight access sites have been recommended in the basin; 25 are complete, 13 need further development. The established camping areas on the Wenaha and Minam Rivers are pointed out on the fold-out map.



The Grande Ronde River has five main tributaries—the Wenaha, Minam, Lostine, and Wallowa Rivers; and Catherine Creek. The basin extends from the Washington state line to the summit of the Wallowa Mountains and La Grande to Enterprise.

One major highway, Interstate 80N through The Dalles and Pendleton, connects La Grande with the centers of population in western Oregon. State Highway 82 links La Grande with Enterprise.

#### LOWER GRANDE RONDE

The Lower Grande Ronde, or that area below Rondowa, is mainly a canyon area with some portions accessible only by boat. The section in the vicinity of Troy from the mouth of Wallupa Creek to the Washington line is paralleled by a good, two-lane gravel road. At Wallupa Creek the road goes up over the divide and on into Wallowa. Troy is the headquarters of the Oregon Game Commission's Wenaha Management Area. Along the river in the vicinity of Troy, the Game Commission owns tracts of land that are adjacent to the river and access is no problem.

The use in this section is mainly by steelhead anglers in September and October and again in February and March, with elk hunters invading the area in November. Moderate angling pressure is exerted upon spring chinook salmon and rainbow trout in late spring and early summer. Fishing pressure is light for smallmouth bass in summer.

The section from Rondowa, the mouth of the Wallowa River, to Wallupa Creek is inaccessible by road. The upper two-thirds of this canyon is in the national forest and the majority of the lower third is Bureau of Land Management land. This canyon has been proposed as a scenic area. It is believed that this designation is best suited to this section of the river.

Rondowa is the upstream point of access to the canyon. All land adjacent to the river at this point is privately owned and an "A" priority for access has been designated. The only other access point to the upper end of the canyon is Minam and it is nine river miles above the scenic area.

The Wenaha joins the Grande Ronde at Troy. This river is only accessible by road for about 1/4 mile above the mouth. A trail begins at Troy and follows up the river for its entire length on the north side. Six camp sites

have been established at points along the trail, but no improvement has been made. They are just level places where a camp can be set up. These locations are pointed out on the fold-out map.

#### GRANDE RONDE VALLEY

The Grande Ronde Valley is the area from Rondowa to the lower end of the state ditch where it returns to the Grande Ronde channel about two miles east of Alicel.

The river enters a canyon about two miles downstream from Elgin. This is the beginning of the canyon that extends clear to the mouth of the river where it empties into the Snake River in Washington. A single lane, dirt road parallels the river for four miles in the vicinity of Looking Glass and Rondowa; the remainder of the canyon is inaccessible by road, but the railroad follows the river all the way to Rondowa.

The river in the canyon is swift and wide and has no deep pool areas.

Angling is restricted to fall, winter, and spring for trout. Summer angling is nonexistent because of extremely low flows and warm water temperatures.

The portion between the state ditch and Elgin flows through an agricultural area and all land that borders the river is privately owned. The fishway is restricted to warm-water game fish--crappie, brown bullheads, yellow perch, and largemouth bass.

Jubilee Meadows Impoundment is a proposed 97-acre lake that will be built in the summer of 1967 by the Oregon Game Commission. Jubilee Meadows is situated in the northernmost tip of Union County. The lake will be built on Mottet Creek, a tributary to Lookingglass Creek which joins the Grande Ronde at the town of Looking Glass.

Two major roads connect the meadows with areas of population--the Eden Bench Road from Troy and the Tollgate Road from Elgin. These two roads near Jubilee Meadows.

The elevation at the meadow is 4,800 feet. Coniferous trees predominate with the meadow being covered with lush grass. When the lake is filled and a fishery with trout is established, it will afford many hours of recreation to a large group of anglers.

REMARKS The Forest Service will be establishing campgrounds, sanitary facilities, and roads adjacent to the lake. This will be done in six phases as money becomes available and the demand for facilities increases. The first phase will include the camp sites with stoves, tables, sanitary facilities, and an adequate road system to provide access to the camp sites.

#### LA GRANDE AREA

The Grande Ronde River in the La Grande area is quite diversified in its physical character. Between the proposed Lower Grande Ronde Dam and Island City the river resembles a typical trout or steelhead stream with wide, gravel bars and long pools. This is the lower end of the steelhead spawning area.

Below La Grande the river enters the valley. It forms a deep channel through grainfields before it is diverted into the state ditch that is 10 feet deep and about 100 feet wide in some places. The river channel below the state ditch diversion has very little moving water and in summer forms a series of stagnant sloughs. As the river nears the lower end of the state ditch, it accumulates returning irrigation water and flows are a little greater. Catherine Creek adds very little water to the river since most of its water is diverted for irrigation.

The area from the proposed Lower Grande Ronde Dam to La Grande offers early spring steelhead angling (March) and spring trout fishing (April and May). The lower Grande Ronde sloughs provide a warm-water fishery for largemouth bass, crappie, yellow perch, and brown bullheads. Although steelhead migrate through the lower area no fishery has been established.

The highway follows the river above La Grande and in most instances angler access to the river is not denied. However, along a few oxbows that leave the highway, it would be advantageous to gain easements. With increased flows from the proposed Lower Grande Ronde Reservoir, all of the area above the confluence of the state ditch will be able to provide a fishery through the summer and time of present low flows. This area has been put under the category "gain access whenever and wherever possible."

REMARKS

This area is in close proximity to La Grande and a need exists at the present time. The demand will be even greater when water flows are increased.

#### CATHERINE CREEK

Catherine Creek joins the Grande Ronde River channel about three miles northwest of Cove. Here the original channel of the Grande Ronde is virtually empty in summer except for some returning irrigation. The section below Lower Davis Dam is primarily a warm-water game fish area.

Lower Davis Dam is the lowest point in the Catherine Creek drainage where salmon angling takes place. Access to this area is no problem. The landowner allows anglers entry at the present time; however, a perpetual easement would be advantageous to insure future access.

The area from Union to Catherine Creek damsite is a good fishing area.

Hatchery rainbow trout are stocked each year to supplement the fair population of native fish. The main angling pressure is exerted in the early summer when water flows are best. With the building of Catherine Creek Dam, larger flows would be sustained below the dam during the summer and if good minimum flows could be established through the fall and winter, a population of trout could be maintained. In the advent of a better trout fishery angler use would, in turn, become heavier. This section has been put under a "whenever and wherever" category with an "A" priority pending the construction of Catherine Creek Dam.

The section above Catherine Creek State Park and the North Fork Campground is the area of legal trout liberations. Nine thousand rainbows are
stocked in this area annually in June, July, and August. The upper half of
this section is within the national forest and access is no problem. The area
below the national forest has been designated a "whenever and wherever" area.

About a mile below the confluence of the North and South Forks, the Mormon Church has an organizational camp. The public is permitted to use the grounds but not the buildings.

#### TONY VEY MEADOWS

This is the headwater area of the Grande Ronde River. It is located on the north side of the Blue Mountains; the stream begins along the Union-Grant County line.

This is not steep country. Rolling mountains are timbered with pine and fir where large meadows comprise most of the area along the streams. The majority of the system flows through the national forest and access is no problem. Tony Vey Meadows, a block of private ownership within the national forest, needs to be made accessible via an easement.

Spring and summer trout fishing is good in this area. The 9,000 hatchery rainbows that are released annually from the mouth of Fly Creek to the East Fork supplement the native trout population.

With the good road access into the national forest and the presence of gentle terrain, this makes a very popular deer and elk hunting area. Hunter use in the fall is heavy.

One Forest Service campground is located about one mile below Vey

Meadows. The establishment of more campgrounds on Forest Service land would
be beneficial and will be needed in the near future.

#### MINAM RIVER AREA

The Minam River joins the Wallowa at the town of Minam along State Highway 82. The lower nine miles of the river are accessible by secondary road, the remainder of the system is accessible by trail.

Camping areas are established along the river and some tributaries; three guide camps are operated along the main river (these are located on the fold-out map). This river is a very popular horse pack-in area and is used heavily by fishermen in summer and deer and elk hunters in the fall.

It is recommended that the camp areas along the river and tributaries remain as they are and that the Minam River in the national forest be left a roadless area. The development of a campground at the national forest boundary is needed to accommodate elk hunters on the lower Minam. The existing road would need improvement to the forest boundary. The Moss Spring road from Elgin needs improvement to provide horse access to trails into the Minam canyon and for wheeled vehicle access to the divide west of the Minam River. This divide is the crossing for elk moving to winter range along the Minam and would afford excellent late season elk hunting.

#### LOWER LOSTINE RIVER

The Lower Lostine River includes the part that flows through private land where the river is bordered by hayfields. The Lostine joins the Wallowa River about two miles upstream from the town of Wallowa. Even though all land is privately owned, there is no access problem for the few anglers that wish to fish this section of the river. Since the upper river is dotted with Forest Service campgrounds and all land is within the national forest, this area gets heavy use which draws anglers away from this lower section.

The development of one site is recommended for this section. An impoundment has been tentatively planned, by the landowner, at the OC Ranch. This location is about two miles from the upper end of the area and affords an excellent place for a lake of approximately 250 surface acres. This site is more fully described on the following site evaluation sheet.



#### REMARKS

This place is a natural for construction of a fishing lake. Impoundment would be about 250 surface acres with a depth of 15-18 feet. Campgrounds could easily be established along the lake shore.

#### UPPER LOSTINE RIVER

The Upper Lostine River lies within the national forest. This is a cool, semi-alpine area with pine and fir thickets adjacent to the river and on the steep mountain sides that form the Lostine canyon. The canyon floor is quite wide in places and offers excellent locations for development of campgrounds. Nine campgrounds have been developed along the Lostine road and are used heavily through the summer and fall. In addition, a horse packer at Lapover Ranch operates through the summer for anglers wishing to fish the high lakes in the Eagle Cap Wilderness Area and in the fall for deer and elk hunters. Two additional areas have been set up for unloading and loading horses for those with their own pack string.

The fishery is for trout--hatchery rainbow, native Dolly Varden, and brook trout. Since snow persists until the middle of June, the first hatchery releases are not made until just before the Fourth of July; additional releases extend into mid-August. Through this mid-summer period the upper river receives 7,000 legal rainbows.

No access problem exists and all access sites are considered complete.

### WALLOWA RIVER AREA

The Wallowa River travels a distance of 50 miles from Wallowa Lake, its source, to Rondowa where it meets the Grande Ronde. The lower 20 miles flow through a canyon; the upper 30 miles makes its way through the Wallowa Valley.

Irrigation diversions are numerous in the valley and water flows become quite low in late summer.

The major fisheries are for spring steelhead (late February and March) and trout. Ten thousand hatchery rainbows are planted in the river each year by the Game Commission to supplement native populations of fish. Angling pressure is centered along the accessible area from Rock Creek to a point about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles below the town of Minam. However, considerable fishing takes place early in the season in the valley where the highway makes the river quite accessible in many places.

In the area between Minam and Rock Creek, there are 14 wide areas or old sections of highway that provide access to the river in addition to the three developed roadside rest areas. Two access points are recommended below Minam.

#### WALLOWA LAKE AREA

At the foot of the Wallowa Mountains the river enters the lake. Formed by glaciation, Wallowa Lake is about 3.5 miles long, covers 1,777 surface acres and is 283 feet deep. It is a very beautiful body of water with its deep blue that is accentuated by the towering snow-covered Wallowas in the background.

Being a deep lake it is well suited for kokanee. Also, lake trout or Mackinaw, Dolly Varden, whitefish, and rainbows are present. The majority of the catch is composed of rainbow trout and kokanee. It is stocked annually with approximately 250,000 kokanee fingerling and 35,000 legal rainbows. The river above the lake is stocked with 2,000 legal rainbows. Many of these fish make their way into the lake.

Wallowa Lake State Park is located at the south end of the lake in a setting of tall conifers. The park offers 147 camp sites with all sanitary and convenience facilities provided. The Oregon Game Commission has established a boat ramp at the north end of the lake.
