

This report details a plan that we hope can be followed to solve the access problem of the Upper South Coast. Too, we hope that all agencies that are interested in retaining existing water access as well as providing additional facilities, whether they be municipal, county, or state, will all join in a cooperative effort to carry out this plan in an orderly manner. It is probable that Land and Water Conservation Funds will be available on a 50-50 matching basis. In order to acquire these funds, it will be necessary to apply through the Oregon State Highway Department.

The Upper South Coast covers the beach and estuary areas of Coos and Douglas Counties. Two major access routes link the area with the interior valleys. Highway 38, the Umpqua Highway, connects Reedsport and Winchester Bay with Eugene and Roseburg. It is one of the better routes to the coast, and on weekends in the summer and early fall the road is crowded with salmon fishermen traveling to and from the coast. Highway 42 is a secondary highway between Roseburg and Coos Bay via Coquille.

Winchester Bay and Coos Bay are the hubs of salmon fishing activity on the Upper South Coast. The facilities that are provided for the salmon angler are excellent as is the fishing. Each location has a large boat basin where moorage and charter boats are available. Also, the reefs and rocks along this portion of the coast abound with bottom fish and the jetties at Bandon, Coos Bay, and Winchester Bay give access to excellent perch and bottom fishing areas. Clams are plentiful on the mud flats of Winchester Bay and on the sand flats of Coos Bay. The Coquille River below Highway 101 affords excellent crabbing.

The Upper South Coast has been broken into six areas containing 29 sites for beach, tidewater, and offshore access. The following six areas are described in detail with evaluation forms for each access site.



The Upper South Coast is made up of the beach and estuary areas in Coos and Douglas Counties.

The main routes to the area are Highway 38 down the Umpqua River and Highway 42 down the middle fork of the Coquille River. Both routes are easily accessible from Interstate 5.

Reedsport is 57 miles from Interstate 5 near Drain and Coos Bay is 85 miles from Roseburg.

BANDON AREA

The Coquille River is the center of sport fishing activity in this area. Perch and bottom fish abound along the jetties. Activity over the bar is nonexistent because the bar is shallow and extremely dangerous. However, the coho fishing in September and October is excellent in the The most popular method of angling is trolling from motor-propelled river. boats.

Bullards Beach State Park is an excellent facility that provides boat access to the bay, road access to the north jetty, camping, picnicking and modern sanitary facilities. It is situated adjacent to Highway 101 just north of the Coquille River bridge.

Two access sites have been established on the Bandon beach loop road. They are the llth Street viewpoint in Bandon and Bandon State Park that is located about three miles south of town.

All facilities in this area are complete and adequate and all desirable areas are provided with access.



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

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

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SEVEN DEVILS AREA

The Seven Devils Area lies north of Bullards Beach State Park and extends to Cape Arago. The majority of the land in this area is Coos County Forest except the privately owned tracts along the beach and the Seven Devils road. The fishery is limited to surf casting for perch and other surf species. Angling pressure is at a minimum since surf fishing has not "caught on" as it has on the east coast.


The sand beaches to the south of Cape Arago are accessible via road from Agate Beach and Whiskey Run. Merchants Beach has no access road but an access road should be provided.



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COOS BAY AREA

Coos Bay is the largest bay on the Oregon Coast. It forms an inverted hook on the map and the cities of North Bend and Coos Bay are situated on the peninsula formed by this hook.

The bay is fingered with numerous sloughs and inlets that provide habitat for a wide variety of fish life. The largest population of striped bass north of San Francisco inhabits Coos Bay and they provide a considerable sport fishery. The offshore and bay fishery for salmon out of Charleston is on a par with other popular salmon ports to the north. Albecore venture within easy access of the coast and offer tuna fishing for the more venturesome anglers. Shad enter the bay but are not caught by sport fishermen until they reach the river.

The many sand and mud flats when exposed during low tides offer excellend clam digging. Crabs abound in the inlets of the bay and Joe Ney Slough is utilized for commercial oyster production.

The South Jetty at Bastendorff Beach is an excellent location for bottom fish and salmon angling. It is an easily accessible site and is becoming more popular each year.

The state parks and viewpoints south of Charleston on the Cape Arago road are excellent facilities. This is a sight-seeing area and one that adds considerably to the aesthetics of the bay area.

Fisheries around Cape Arago consist of surf perch and bottom fish from the rocks and beaches with an established net fishery for smelt in the surf at Mussel Beach just south of the Coos Bay entrance. Coos Bay is dotted with strategically located boat ramps to provide access to all fishing areas. Charleston is the center of the offshore boat activity with a large public ramp and boat basin. It is an excellent facility and adequately serves the area.

SAND DUNES AREA

The Oregon sand dunes are situated between Coos Bay and the Siuslaw River. However, in this plan the sand dunes area will be restricted to the beach section between Coos Bay and the Coos County line. The Tahkenitch Area covers the north dune section to the Lane County line.

The Oregon dunes are scattered with numerous lakes that harbor warm-water fish and trout. They all offer recreational potential and are covered in the Coos and Curry and Lane County plan.

The sand dunes are indigenous to the southern Oregon coast. The huge undulating dunes drift with the prevailing winds. Attempts have been made in a few areas to plant dune grass to help stabilize the moving sand. In most instances the plantings have been successful.

A type of vehicle has been developed called a "dune or beach buggy". It is a stripped down car with large balloon tires that will navigate the sand ridges with relative ease. Until recently the dune buggy has been the only means of motored access to the dunes and adjoining beach. A few years ago a paved access road was built to the beach at Horsefall Lake. Future plans of the Forest Service call for a beach road between the mouth of Tenmile Creek and the Horsefall Lake access with a spur road into Beale Lake. In conjunction with this road a large campground is proposed at the bend in Tenmile Creek.

The following evaluation sheets indicate the various access developments that are proposed. When completed the area will be adequately served with access routes and recreational developments.

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WINCHESTER BAY AREA


This area extends south of the Umpqua River mouth to the Coos County line and north to Threemile Creek. The bay itself is located about a mile upriver from the Umpqua jetties.

At the bay a vast boat basin has been provided with boat ramps, moorage and charter boats, camping and picnic facilities, and restaurants to accommodate the hordes of salmon anglers that come each summer for the excellent fishing. The season begins in June and gains momentum until its peak in August and September. Coho predominate the catch but large chinook are not uncommon.

The south jetty has become a very popular bank fishing area. The perch fishing is excellent in spring and summer, and salmon are readily taken in late summer and fall. The action shifts to the big bend area below Gardiner in January through March for the large white sturgeon, and then to striped bass around Gardiner and lower Smith River in the spring and summer. Also, the early spring low tides expose the vast mud flats around Gardiner and make the eastern softshell clams available. This area provides excellent digging and the clams are large.

Generally speaking the access in this area is adequate and is continually being improved and expanded. The following section presents the access picture in more detail.







The sand dunes between Threemile Creek and the Douglas County line comprise this area. For $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles north and south of the Threemile Creek road there is nothing but undulating sand dunes and the perpetual pounding of the surf.

Road improvement at Threemile Creek and an access road down Tahkenitch Creek is recommended for an adequate access of the dunes area. Complete road access to Threemile Lake is not advocated since it would destroy the area's primitive setting.

This road is used for beach access in its present state but improvement would make the area more readily accessible to cars. The Forest Service has long-range plans to bring a new road from Highway 101 to the beach via Threemile Lake with a campground development at Threemile Lake. However, a system of carefully positioned trails in place of road access adjacent to the lake would facilitate angler access without substantially altering the area's primitive setting. This alternate plan for access development may have merit and should be given consideration.
