Develop the Angler's Guide to Oregon Hatcheries, the first comprehensive digital education platform dedicated to helping Oregon anglers understand, appreciate, and responsibly utilize Oregon's hatchery system.

Recruit new recreational anglers by providing a free, educational resource to help them fish confidently and legally in accordance with Oregon's fishing regulations.

Promote opportunities for volunteer involvement in STEP programs across the state.

Design, develop, and publicly launch a fully functional, mobile-friendly website featuring comprehensive educational content about Oregon's hatchery system and recreational fishing opportunities.

Current Situation/Justification

Please describe the current situation and explain why this funding is needed.

ODFW's statewide hatchery review identified infrastructure, climate, production, and funding challenges and estimates approximately \$200 million is needed for maintenance and improvements. While the Legislature provided \$20 million in 2025–27 bond funding for hatchery resilience and infrastructure, substantial needs remain.

In June 2026, the Bonneville Power Administration announced termination of \$2.4 million in annual support for the Select Area Fisheries Enhancement (SAFE) program), placing approximately 7 million salmon scheduled for release in 2027 at risk and raising concerns about impacts to Oregon's recreational and commercial fisheries.

ODFW is also advancing a proposed \$76 million Umpqua hatchery complex, including a partial rebuild of Rock Creek Hatchery, while Salmon River Hatchery production has shifted to other facilities following the decision not to fund continued operations in the 2025–27 budget.

These developments underscore the need for anglers to understand Oregon's hatchery system, why individual programs exist, how hatchery decisions affect fishing opportunities, and where anglers can access hatchery-supported fisheries.

The Angler's Guide to Oregon Hatcheries will translate complex hatchery and fisheries-management information into an accessible statewide resource, helping anglers understand and utilize existing opportunities while encouraging informed public engagement in decisions shaping Oregon's hatchery system.

The completed website, hatchery profiles, interactive maps, educational articles, photography, videos, downloadable fishing guides, infographics, and outreach materials will be available for use by ODFW, local chapters, watershed councils, tourism organizations, schools, conservation groups, fishing clubs, and other partners. Materials will be designed for broad public use to support angler education, promote hatchery-supported recreational fisheries, and increase public understanding of Oregon's hatchery system. Future updates and expansion of the content will ensure the resource remains relevant and valuable to anglers and partner organizations statewide.

Project Design and Description

Please describe in detail the methods or approach that will be used to achieve the project objectives.

The project will emphasize accuracy, consistency, and long-term usability while translating complex fisheries information into engaging educational content for recreational anglers.

Using a phased approach that combines technical research, field documentation, digital media production, web development, and scientific review, we will build our library of data and multimedia content.

We will use a mixture of new content (photos, videos, maps and copy) while also utilizing existing partner content to keep costs well within budget parameters.

Project Management and Maintenance

What is the life expectancy of R&E funded construction, structures, equipment, supplies, data or fishery?

No permanent structures will be constructed, and no specialized equipment requiring long-term maintenance will be purchased with R&E funds.

The information accumulated in the Anglers Guide will be near evergreen, with major content revisions occurring with hatchery management practice changes.

Who is responsible for long term management, maintenance, and oversight of the project beyond what is funded by R&E.

The Association of Northwest Steelheaders (ANWS) will be responsible for the long-term management, maintenance, and oversight of the Angler's Guide to Oregon Hatcheries following completion of the R&E-funded project. ANWS will maintain website hosting, domain registration, software updates, security, and routine maintenance using organizational operating funds.

Will the project require ongoing maintenance?

Content will be reviewed annually, or more frequently as needed, to incorporate changes to hatchery operations, fish production, fishing regulations, public access information, and other updates provided by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife. ANWS staff will coordinate with ODFW Fish Division personnel to ensure technical information remains current. The

project's digital assets—including photographs, videos, maps, graphics, and educational materials—will be maintained in ANWS's permanent digital media library and reused for future educational, outreach, and promotional efforts. As new hatchery facilities, fisheries, or educational opportunities emerge, ANWS will update and expand the website without requiring significant redevelopment.

Is there a plan to collect baseline data and to conduct monitoring efforts to measure the effectiveness of the project?

Yes

Following launch, ANWS will use website analytics to establish and track measures including unique users, page views, time spent on hatchery profiles, interactive map use, downloads, geographic reach, referral sources, and repeat visitation.

ANWS will also collect feedback from ODFW, fishing clubs, watershed organizations, and other partners regarding accuracy, usefulness, and gaps in the resource.

Summary of Review Team Comments

The internal review team gave this project a cumulative score of 1.9

Specific Review Team Comments

It is not clear how much input or review of the materials ODFW would have to ensure information is correct.

ODFW review and final approval of the final product should be mentioned more clearly in the application and be required in order to ensure materials are accurate and reflect agency policy and direction.

If funded, ODFW should play a key role in the development, review and editing of the final product and prior to distribution to the public.

I appreciate the willingness to bring attention to hatcheries

Specific Review Team Questions

Will information about ODFW hatcheries be reviewed by ODFW prior to being posted on this mobile app?

Yes.

ANWS has already had preliminary conversations with ODFW leadership, in which we were provided positive feedback on the concept and confirmed they could help review work products for accuracy.

All information concerning ODFW hatcheries, fish production, release programs, conservation objectives, fisheries management, and hatchery-supported fishing opportunities will be submitted to ODFW for technical review and approval prior to publication.

Draft hatchery profiles and related technical content will be provided to ODFW for review, and ANWS will incorporate appropriate corrections and recommendations before publication.

The project will use ODFW's hatchery records, Fish Propagation Annual Reports, applicable management plans, current regulations, and other agency-approved information as primary sources.

No ODFW-specific content will be publicly released without ODFW's review and approval.

ANWS will remain responsible for website administration, formatting, photography, outreach, and ongoing maintenance, while coordinating future substantive updates with ODFW.

Can this be accomplished by the end of the biennium?

Yes. The project can be completed by the end of the biennium. ANWS will manage the project

schedule so that all R&E-funded development, content creation, ODFW technical review and approval, website testing, and public launch are completed by June 30, 2029.

ODFW review will be incorporated at critical project junctures rather than reserved for the end of the project, allowing revisions to occur concurrently with development.

ANWS will coordinate with designated ODFW staff at project kickoff, during development of hatchery profiles, and during final quality assurance. The completed product will not be publicly released until ODFW has reviewed and approved the ODFW-specific information.

Ongoing promotion and maintenance after June 30, 2029 will be supported by ANWS and will not depend on additional R&E funding.

How will this product seek information from ODFW and is there ODFW Propagation staff capacity to provide, edit and review this information?

ANWS will obtain information directly from ODFW sources including ODFW reports, hatchery records, management plans, and publicly available agency information.

The 2025 Fish Propagation Annual Report identifies Fish Propagation as the section responsible for coordinating hatchery production, hatchery information and systems support, production evaluation, and related hatchery functions.

To minimize demands on ODFW staff, ANWS will conduct the initial research and prepare standardized draft profiles for each hatchery using existing ODFW-approved information.

Drafts will then be provided to ODFW for technical review, correction, and final approval before publication. ANWS will consolidate questions and submit materials in organized batches rather than requesting repeated individual reviews.

ANWS has had conversations with ODFW staff confirming staff availability and a commitment of minimal staff time to review content.

Aside from brief interviews, ODFW staff time will not be requested or utilized for the development of project materials.

Who will be in charge of updating content in the future as things change, and who will cover the costs associated with that work?

The Association of Northwest Steelheaders (ANWS) will be responsible for the long-term management and updating of the Angler's Guide. ANWS will conduct an annual review of the website and update information as hatchery programs, fish releases, fishing regulations, public access, and other relevant information change.
