Project Summary

This project is NOT part of ODFW's 25 Year Angling Plan.

Activity Type: Education

Summary: We are restoring and updating an old tourist display in the historic hatch

house building at the Bonneville Hatchery. The old display has not been open to the public for several years. Two Mt Hood Community College fisheries students, Jessie Elmore and myself, Jenni Remillard, are using this restoration as our senior project. We have developed new display ideas and have begun gathering information. This new display will be on the Bonneville Hatchery itself, highlighting the hatchery's history, species of

fish raised, a waterflow map, etc. We feel this project will add to the

hatchery's centennial celebration in 2009.

Objectives: Currently, there are no displays on the Bonneville Hatchery itself, and our

main goal is to educate the public about the hatchery. We feel that this is extremely important as hatcheries are supported by taxpayers. Also, we

hope to dispel any misconceptions the public may have towards

hatcheries. This project will benefit the public and help educate them about

the Bonneville Hatchery as well as the fish Bonneville raises.

Fishery Benefits: Many people are curious about hatcheries, especially fishermen. By

learning how a hatchery like Bonneville operates, they can form educated

opinions and decisions.

Watershed Benefits: Although we are not directly benefiting a watershed, we will be providing

free information that visitors can take to learn more about protecting

watersheds.

Current Situation: The existing tourist display in the hatch house is in need of some repairs

and updating. The area needs new wall paneling, carpet, and will also need to be painted. Some work has already been completed. We have removed all of the stored material from the area and have begun working on restoring the display cases which were already present. Much of the text for the displays has been gathered and will now need to be formatted for printing on signs. Photographs and items for the display cases have also been gathered. We now need help with funding to complete the

displays.

Alternatives: We have applied for other grants and have so far been turned down. If we

do not come up with funding, we will not be able to re-open the area to the

public.

Designer: Hatchery Manager, Hatchery maintenance staff, and MHCC Fisheries

students.

Methods: We have already cleared out the area. We must now put up new paneling,

paint, replace the old carpet, print out the display text on signs, restore the display cases and create the new displays. We will also enclose the overlook with plexiglass to protect visitors and displays. Since school began in the fall, we have been researching and compiling data from numerous sources. We now need to format this information into displays.

Funding Elements: R&E funds will be used mainly for the life cycle models. Realistic, long

lasting life cycle models are quite expensive. We will also use funds for plexiglass and text for the display signs. We want to have professional,

educational displays.


